




Engagement Programs

This year, the Baltimore Tree Trust (BTT) expanded our engagement programming to further tree stewardship across residents of the city. Through tabling events, volunteer tree plantings, outdoor education programs, and nursery community days, BTT engaged over 950 tree enthusiasts in the exciting and important work of expanding our city's tree canopy. In addition to physically planting trees with community members, we put a lot of focus into educating our community on how trees benefit Baltimore and how we, in turn, can ensure that Baltimore City's tree canopy survives and thrives for generations to come. With volunteers from Baltimore City Schools, faith groups, governmental agencies, and environmentally conscious corporations, we planted over 160 trees through our engagement programs alone.

Of special note, we continued our ongoing collaborative partnership with Baltimore City Public Schools to bring more trees—and tree education—to students and staff. To this end, we have been developing a "menu" of educational program options geared to schools including topics such as Social Emotional Learning with Trees, Beginner Tree Identification, and Green Career Exploration.

Looking Ahead A Strategic Step Forward for Baltimore Tree Trust

In 2024, the Baltimore Tree Trust initiated its first strategic planning process, which will conclude in 2025, with generous support from the Goldseker Foundation. This endeavor aims to strengthen the organization's foundation and better equip it to meet the evolving demands of the environmental sector, particularly in light of increasing climate challenges and funding reductions.

The strategic plan highlights essential areas for the Baltimore Tree Trust's long-term sustainability and impact. Key objectives include diversifying revenue sources, boosting unrestricted philanthropic investments, and enhancing fee-for-service offerings. The Tree Trust also aims to improve tree survivorship in Baltimore's urban areas, especially in communities vulnerable to climate change.

A key aspect of this strategy is strengthening the workforce development program. By enhancing training and career pathways for Neighborhood Foresters, the Tree Trust seeks to create local green jobs and empower individuals to pursue long-term careers in urban forestry.

This effort comes at a critical time, as uncertainties in public funding and federal and state budget cuts present significant challenges to environmental nonprofits nationwide. The Baltimore Tree Trust is proactively preparing for this reality, and it needs your support to thrive.
